A professional administrator has been hired to care for, archive and promote Main Hall, its contents and its memories.

Previous to her current position, Scheehle worked for 10 years as the executive director of the Milton Historical Society and as curator of the Milton House Museum. Through this work Judy has become keenly aware of the impact that our small liberal arts college has had on Milton, WI. She is the first paid employee hired by the Main Hall Preservations Society (MHPS).

### THEATER REUNION

Very few seats were available in the Chapel of Main Hall on the afternoon of June 21, 2003 when nearly 100 alumni of Milton's theater program gathered to honor **Herb Crouch '41**, Professor of Speech and Theater from 1948 through 1982.

The event was organized by a dedicated group headed up by **Virginia (Burdick) Duncan w'56**. The organizers were very careful not to let Herb know that the event was really a

tribute to him and his work. Herb was told that the event would focus on the Milton's tradition of Shakespearean theater. Crouch and former students performed readings from "Hamlet", "Taming of the Shrew" and "Much Ado About Nothing" It wasn't until after the reading were finished that Herb found out that it was really all about him and was he was surprised and moved.

The Thespians in attendance and even those who could not make the trip found a way to let Herb now how much he meant to them. The tribute included; a framed cast lists of all the Shakespearean plays he directed, a memory book of letters and pictures from well-wishers and a check in the amount of \$1,000. The final acknowledgment of Herb's contributions Milton College was the presentation of four restored antique chairs to be kept in Main Hall. The chairs have been designated "The Professor Herbert L. Crouch Chairs of Dramatic Arts".

Contributions and attendees came from all across the United States. **Helen (McFarland) Thorngate** could not attend, but sent greetings and photos of the 1943 production of "Midsummer's Night's Dream". **Anita (Piper) Charboneau** flew in from Las Vegas, NV just for the event. Anita played Ophelia opposite Herb in the 1940 production of "Hamlet". **Mary (Wahl) Johnson '51** recreated her role as Puck and remembered the magnificent leading performance given by **Kathleen Clement**, who now lives in Mexico. One of the most unique "characters" in attendance was Elmer Lipke, who is the only thespian at Milton who every played the same part twice....in two different productions. He played Bottom in the 1943 production of "Midsummer's Night's Dream" and then went off to war. When he returned after the war, he came back to school and played Bottom in the 1948 production of the same play.

The event was a huge success in no small part to the contributions and "behind the scenes" efforts of so many dedicated people. Congratulations Herb!

The Milton Area Athletic Hall of Fame inducted three Milton College standouts at its ceremony on Wednesday April 9, 2003. The Milton Hall of Fame inducted **Kenneth "Red" Oberbruner**, his son **Kenneth "Skip" Oberbruner** and **Richie Rusch**. Red was a former University of Notre Dame basketball and baseball player. As head coach in football, basketball and baseball, "**Red" Oberbruner** literally was a one-man athletic department at Milton College for 23 years. His Wildcat teams had winning records in every sport. He went on to coach at UW Parkside and just prior to his retirement he reached seventh on the all-time NCAA Division II baseball list for career victories. Red had 24 baseball players sign professional contracts. He passed away in 1993. His son **Skip** won 11 letters at Milton high and moved on to an accomplished career in football, basketball and baseball at Milton College. While at Milton in 1969 he set school records for scoring and touchdown passes in one season. As a senior on the Wildcat baseball team, his .500 batting average ranked fifth nationally in the NAIA. **Richie Rusch** was a four-year starter on the Milton High School basketball team and as a senior led Milton to the championship game in the 1976 Class B sectional semifinals. Rusch lettered four times at Milton College where he also played baseball and golf.

## MAIN HALL PRESERVATION SOCIETY RECEIVES GRANT

The Main Hall Preservation Society announces that it has received a grant from the Milton Fund to support the preservation of documents pertaining to Milton College. In the twenty years since the closing of Milton College, thousands of photos and other items have been donated and stored in the Main Hall archives. However, newspapers articles, documents and photos were beginning to yellow from lack of proper storage and organization. The grant award from the Milton Fund will purchase acid free materials and photo storage boxes for these historical documents. Staff and volunteers will continue this project until the archives are readily accessible for research, exhibit and the enjoyment of the community and the remaining alumni throughout the world.

This grant is made available from the Milton Fund, a component of the Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin. The Milton Fund, an endowment fund to benefit Milton, responds to not-for-profit organizations wanting to start new programs, or expand services. Grants from the Milton Funds have strengthened ties between generations and have encouraged community participation in the arts, education, health and human service programs, and historic preservation.
