Alumni Notes



Glen Pound

Research questions that come into MCPS many times take interesting twists. This was the case of 1941 graduate, Glen Pound. Patty Z. contacted MCPS while sorting items belonging to her elderly parents in a small town in Illinois. She discovered that they had personal items of Glen Pound, including a few Milton College items. There was no relationship

with her family to Glen. Glen's deceased uncle was a friend of her grandfather. She wanted to give these items to Pound's relatives and was hoping MCPS could help in this endeavor. After staff research uncovered Glen's obituary and other information, it was determined there were no living immediate relatives. Glen's widowed mother had moved from West Allis, Wisconsin where Glen grew up, to her home town in Illinois. She lived with her brother, Patty's grandfather's friend. It was unfortunate that the items had not been found earlier. Glen died in 2007. He was a retired English-Linguistic Professor at Indiana State University with a doctorate from Indiana University. Patty is going to send items for the MCPS archives. Patty and staff member, Judy Scheehle, both felt a more personal connection to Pound after the research.

Ron Sutterlin w76 of Sutterlin's Restorations has been contracted by the City of Janesville to restore the cupola, finials and doors for the city's historic Tallman House.

Kris Koeffler `73 won gold medals in the Badger State Games for swimming the 50, 100, and 200 meter freestyle events.

Marcia (Knauer) Drogue`73 is in her 36th year of teaching in the Sun Prairie Wisconsin School District and at a district event in June, was recognized for her contributions to the many students she has taught.

Jim Drogue`73 is the VP of Credit Union Development for the Wisconsin Credit Union League and has been employed for the last 25 years at a credit union in Sun Prairie. In 2009 Jim was designated as a Development Educator by the National Credit Union Foundation.

Gwen Reinboldt Corey `74 recently helped identify MC photos via e-mail. In conversations she relayed she had been the Shipboard Director of the USS YORKTOWN CV-10 Association at Patriots Point Naval and Maritime Museum in Charleston, SC. "The moments the door opened and a former crewmember (1943-1970) came in, were some of the most touching." After leaving that position she has worked with the U.S. Census as Field Operations Supervisor. Gwen is currently looking for employment opportunities. She also recalled her experience in Leland Shaw's English class. "I recall the difficulty in staying awake in Prof. Shaw's class in the old chapel. As tough as it was to deal with the echoed monotone voice of Prof. Shaw, his class on Moby Dick captured my interest. His delivery was as if he personally knew Moby Dick."

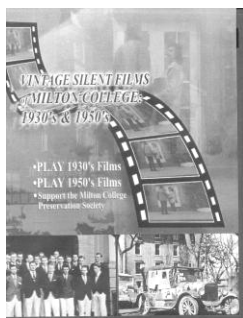
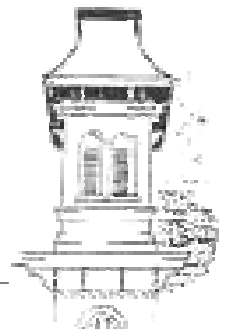
